Dear Moriah Family,

2021 was a milestone year for The Moriah Foundation as we celebrated our 10-year anniversary. The Foundation was established in 2011 to raise funds to purchase the land for the Queens Park campus, and importantly, to support as many children as possible to receive a Moriah education.

Since inception, thanks to all our generous donors, we have achieved more than we had dreamt possible in such a short period of time. We've become a Foundation that enables life-changing opportunities, that inspires, that empowers and that sets off a spark in so many.

With close to 200 Foundation Member families, 75 Foundation Circle Member families, hundreds of members in our Grandparents Club, numerous Corporate Sponsors, alumni and with the remarkable support of our Moriah family and friends, we are proud of what we have achieved to date. We are very grateful for the community's continued support and investment in Moriah students and are delighted that a number of new families continue to join The Moriah Foundation and Foundation Circle out of a desire to help the College to help our families.

Over the last 10 years, together we have raised over \$30M for our children, met our debt repayment obligations to the bank, and assisted hundreds of children to receive a Moriah life and education they would not otherwise have been able to afford. We have brought a range of innovative programs to all our children, invested in our educators, improved our children's learning environments and have begun building an endowment fund to secure the long-term sustainability of our school.

Perhaps never more so than in the last two years, since the outbreak of the pandemic, we have seen the power of unity, compassion, generosity, and responsibility, as our Moriah family has come together without hesitation to support the payment of school fees for over 200 children whose families were financially impacted by Covid.

In addition to our donors' outpouring of support for families whose livelihoods were decimated by the pandemic, an unprecedented 54 children received a Moriah Foundation Bursary, including five new bursaries for children who joined our Moriah family in 2021. The need for bursaries and financial support in our community continues to grow and we are extremely grateful to all our bursary donors.

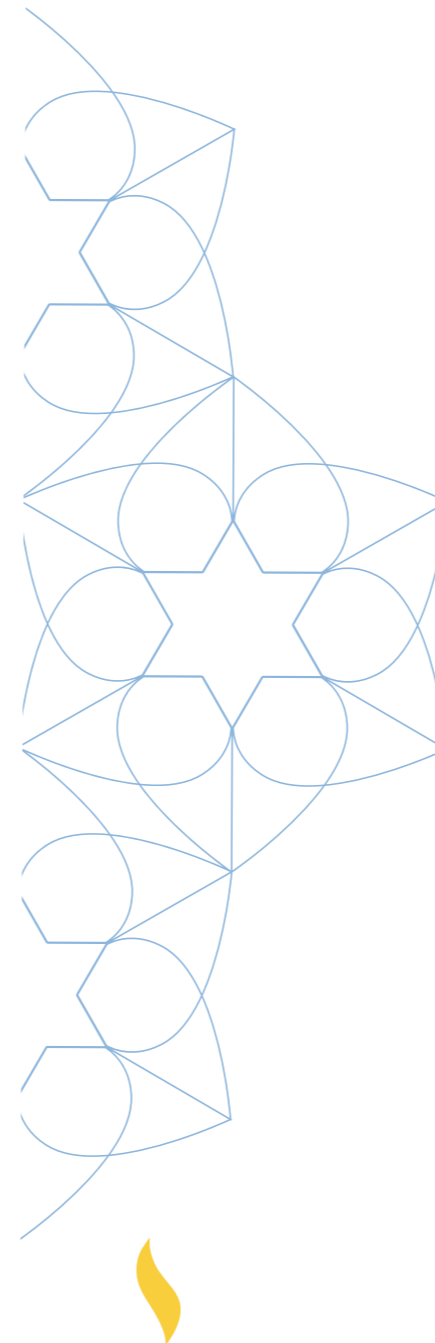

Our Foundation invited The Mount Scopus Foundation to join an exclusive online event with eminent Tel Aviv University professors sharing insights and learnings from Israel's experience in leading the pathway out of the pandemic through the delivery of the world's fastest vaccine rollout.

Alan provided insights into how he navigated this difficult time, the way Qantas is adapting to the new norm in flying and what we can all expect when we start travelling again.

Our grandparents remain such valued members of our Moriah family and in March we were delighted to host our annual Grandparents Club Morning Tea for our grandparents and special friends, with special guest speaker Mark Hemphill, Head of High School. Mark shared insights into what makes Moriah so unique and thanked our grandparents for the important role they play in the lives of our families.

Due to Covid related travel restrictions, we were disappointed that our global signature programs were unable to proceed in 2021. However, The Foundation was proud to once again sponsor Mikolot: Voices of the Future. The competition enables High School students from Jewish schools across Australia, to cultivate their public speaking skills and foster a more refined expression of their Jewish voice, and it was particularly pleasing to announce the winner as one of our very own Moriah students, Ben Lonstein. To reflect the importance of our signature programs, I am delighted Arnold Bloch Leibler will become the exclusive sponsor of the Mikolot: Voices of the Future public speaking competition for five years, commencing in 2022.

MORIAH RESPONSE 2020

No family left behind

In 2020, with the outbreak of Covid, more than 100 Moriah families found themselves in a position they never thought they would face.

Their businesses and jobs were decimated, and they turned to Moriah for help as they were unable to meet their school fee obligations. We were determined that no child should have to leave the school because of the pandemic and committed to supporting our families, until they were able to get back on their feet.

The Moriah Foundation launched the **Moriah Response: No Family Left Behind Campaign** to raise the necessary funds to support our children, and to assist the College in repaying the \$4.8M debt repayment from the purchase of the Queens Park land.

We turned to our Moriah family for assistance, and despite the uncertain and challenging times, in an inspirational display of generosity and compassion, our community came together to ensure that our Moriah children could remain at Moriah where they belong.

The campaign concluded in June 2021 and with the

generous support of more than 300 donors, and \$1M from JCA, more than \$7.8M was raised to assist our families and meet our obligations to the bank. Some of our families have now resumed their usual fee payments while others continue to require our support.

The Foundation remains focused on helping all our families who are experiencing financial hardship, and who qualify for support, whether due to the pandemic or not, and assisting as many new children as possible to receive a Moriah education. Donations of all amounts, big and small, to the Bursary and Financial Assistance Fund are much needed and much appreciated.

Bursary Program

The Moriah Foundation Bursary Program enables children from financially impacted circumstances to receive a Moriah education and all its offerings by qualifying for long-term Financial Assistance.

With the generous support of our bursary donors, in 2021, The Foundation provided 54 children with a bursary including five new bursaries awarded to children who began their educational journey at Moriah for the first time.

The Moriah Foundation Bursaries cover between 50 to 100 per cent of a child's school fees, depending on the family's financial circumstances. The Moriah Debtors and Fee Support Committee carefully assesses every applicant's financial situation to ensure the bursaries are awarded to those in genuine financial need and who embrace and align with the ethos of the College.

Bursaries may be awarded for Primary or High School or for the entire schooling from Year K to Year 12.

A Moriah Foundation Bursary is a transformative gift that enables families who do not have the financial means to cover the cost of school fees to join our Moriah family.

Moriah bursary donors receive an annual Bursary Outcomes Report, providing them with insights into the impact of

their support, without revealing the identity of the bursary recipients. Bursary donors are providing tens of children a year, who otherwise would not be able to access a Moriah education, with a quality Jewish and general education, and all the opportunities and experiences that come with being a student at Moriah College.

Many of our bursary recipients have shared their heart-warming reflections of this transformative and life-changing impact made possible through the generosity of our bursary donors.

In the words of one of our grateful parents whose children received bursaries,

"If it wasn't for the generosity of the donors who make a Jewish education possible, it would truly be beyond our means to afford our children this incredible opportunity of them receiving their schooling at Moriah. We don't take any of the offerings at the school for granted. Our children have loved every day at school. We are humbled to have this opportunity that you and the donors have afforded us."



Several new bursaries were dedicated in 2021 to recognise donors who made a significant contribution to our No Family Left Behind Campaign, assisting children to remain at Moriah.

Providing a Jewish education to as many Jewish children as possible remains a core goal of The Moriah Foundation, and we extend our deep appreciation to our bursary donors for their important and meaningful gifts.

of resilience, maintaining your mental health and ensuring your children know that your love for them is unconditional.

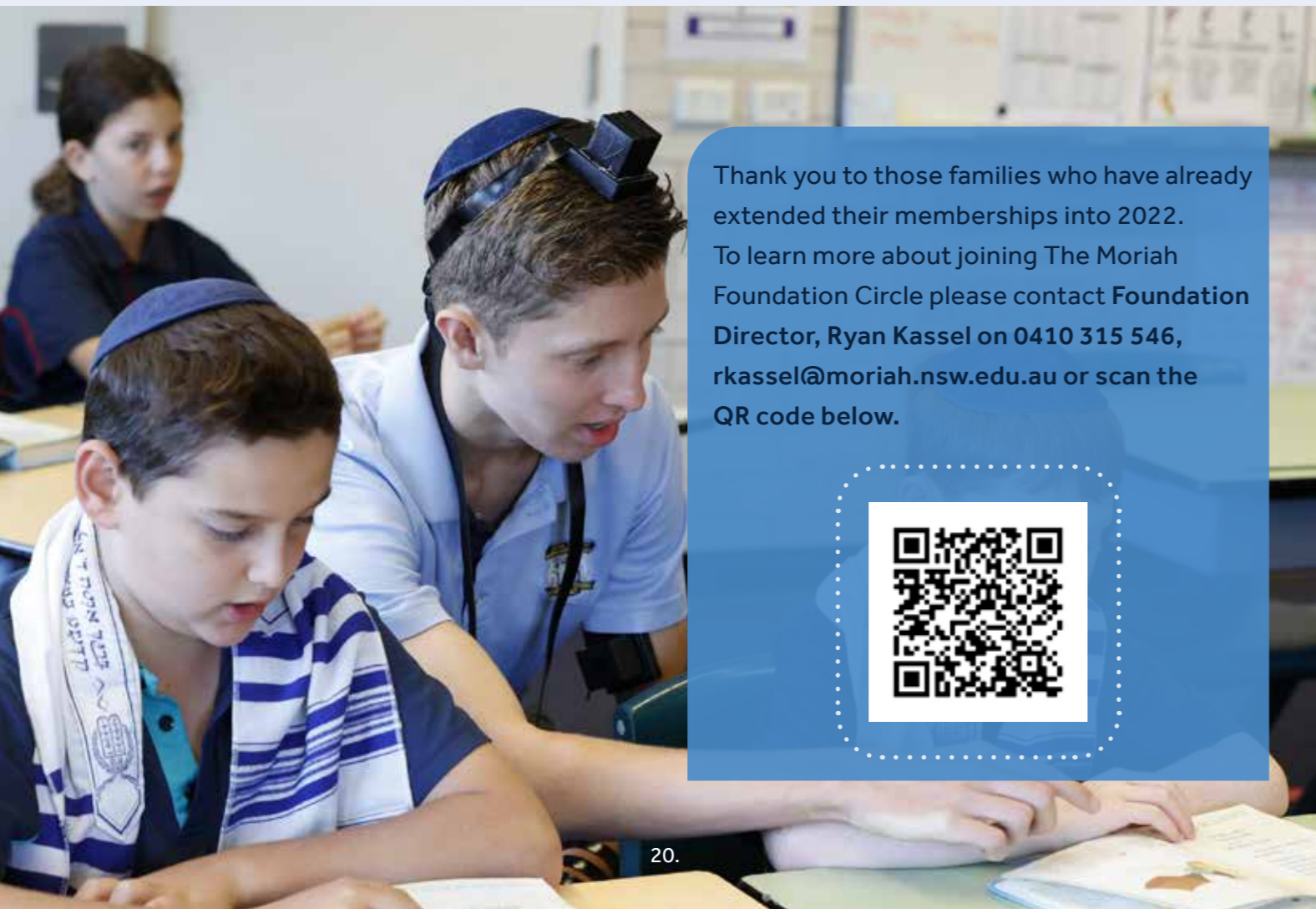

While we were disappointed IST, Brownstone Jewish Leadership and Scholars in Entrepreneurship, (three of our signature programs) were unable to proceed due to Covid travel restrictions, we were honoured to sponsor Mikolot: Voices of the Future, providing High School students from Jewish schools across Australia, with the opportunity to develop their Jewish voice.

Mikolot: Voices of the Future 2021

The Moriah Foundation was delighted to again sponsor the national public speaking competition, Mikolot: Voices of the Future, as we remain focused on bringing a range of innovative programs and global opportunities to our students and community.

44 students from Jewish schools across Australia between Years 10 to Year 12 participated in the competition, including Moriah College, Emanuel School, and Masada College in Sydney, Carmel School in Perth, and Bialik College, King David School and Leibler Yavneh College in Melbourne.

Mikolot promotes collaboration between our Jewish school students, cultivates the public speaking skills of our youth, and fosters a refined expression of Jewish voices in the modern world.

Students prepare and present a short address on a topic relating to Jewish life and are encouraged to consider how they can positively contribute to society and the Jewish world and enhance their capacity to influence others.

Following three challenging rounds of competition, the Mikolot Grand Final Competition was hosted by Moriah College in November 2021 at a pre-recorded online assembly during which the seven finalists presented their addresses.



The competition was judged by an eminent, expert panel including Former Prime Minister of Australia Malcolm Turnbull AC, founding editor of women's lifestyle magazine, Marie Claire Australia and founder of Be Frank Group, Jackie Frank, and Rabbi of Kehillat Kadimah, Rabbi Dovy Rapoport.

An eternal legacy from Dr Charles Frater

The Moriah Foundation is extremely grateful to the late Dr Charles Frater Z"L who kindly left a gift in his Will to Moriah College.

Charles was born in Győr, Hungary in 1922 and in August 1939, Charles's father Artur Frater sent Charles to Switzerland to save his life. Sadly, Charles never saw his father again as he, along with most of Charles's family, were murdered in Auschwitz.

Charles lived in Switzerland throughout the war and in 1944 enrolled in Bern University where he earned his Ph.D in economics. Charles then immigrated to Australia in 1948 having borrowed the money for his boat fare, worked in several jobs and started a number of his own businesses.

In 1972 Charles opened the hugely successful "Centrepont Tavern" which he ran until lease expiry in 1993. He also operated "Sydney Tower Restaurants" until he sold the restaurants in 2004.

Charles was a lover of most art forms and regularly attended performances of opera, ballet, theatre, jazz and classical music in Australia and overseas. He was also an adventurous and experienced traveller whose love of high-altitude trekking took him to some of the most remote and challenging parts of the world, including Mt Everest base, Kangchenjunga, Kilimanjaro, K2, Alaska, Patagonia and the Andes.


Charles died in October 2020, at 98 years of age and provided a generous bequest to Moriah, requesting the funds be allocated to The Moriah Foundation Bursary Program, to enable a child from a financially disadvantaged family to receive an outstanding education at Moriah.

In acknowledging the generous gift, Foundation President Judy Lowy said, "In leaving a gift in his Will to Moriah, Dr Frater has provided a child whose family does not have the financial means to cover the cost of a private school, with the life-changing gift of a Moriah education. We are deeply appreciative of Dr Frater's important and meaningful support. He has left a legacy of immeasurable impact."

The Dr Charles Frater Primary School Memorial Bursary has been named in honour of Dr Frater to acknowledge his transformative gift. May Dr Frater's memory be a blessing.

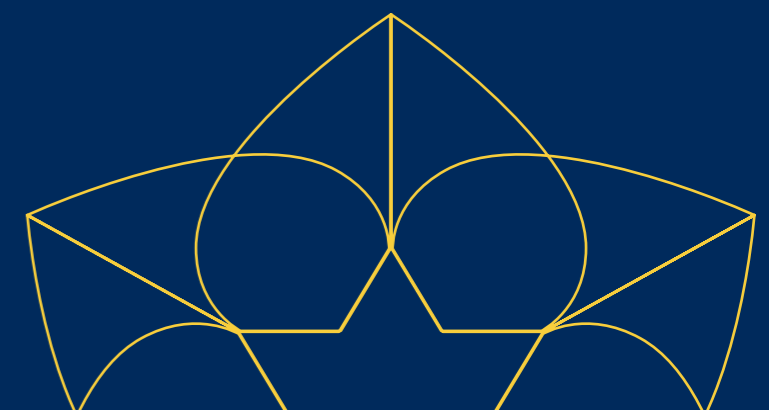

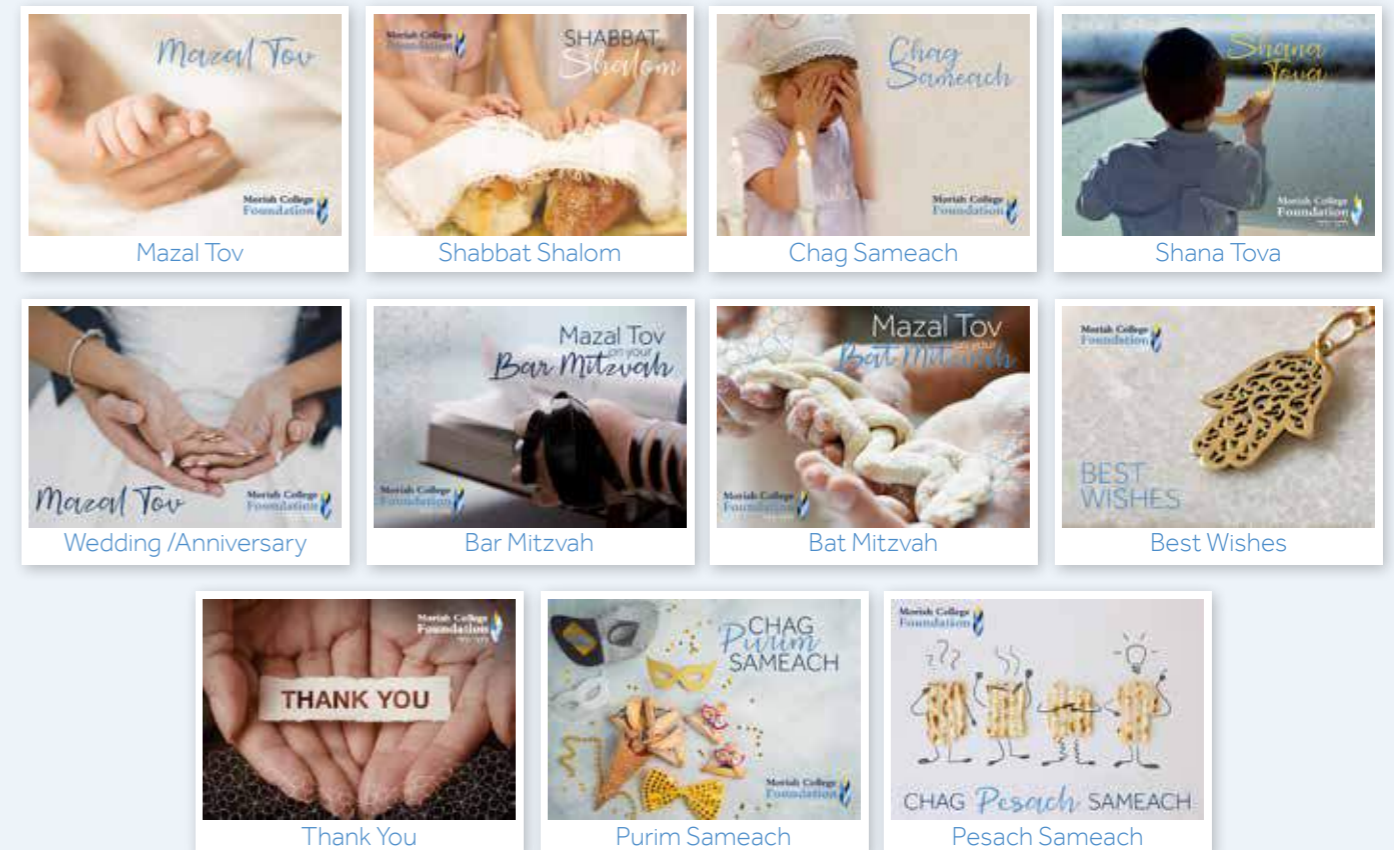
